

Lisburn II – 5, Enniskillen II – 13

Enniskillen's 2nds made it a great Saturday on the road with another hard fought victory in a very physical encounter.

'Skins were once again forced into a number of changes, but this lack of continuity in personnel did not deter them from their task as they recorded an excellent win on the road against a team sitting four places above them, having won four of their five games to date.

Richie O'Callaghan scored the vital try in the first half and with Zac Charlton adding the conversion, and a later Dale McMaster penalty, 'Skins led 10 – 0 at the half time break, despite having at one stage been reduced to thirteen men due to the referee's yellow card.
